Rowena Dring is a British Artist who has lived and worked in Amsterdam since 2001. She received her BA (Hon) at Chelsea College of Art and Design, London, 1990-93 and her Master's degree in Fine Art at Goldsmiths College, University of London, London, MA, 1996-98.

After graduating from Chelsea, Dring was a key figure in the running of Derbyshire Street Arts in the East end of London along with Matthew Collings, Fiona Banner and Bob & Roberta Smith. She established herself as an artist working across different media destabilising conventional categories and boundaries such as male/female, nature/culture, art/ craft that used to define art. Her first introduction to Germany was in the 1999 exhibition, *Mode of Art* at the Kunstverein fürdie Rheinlande un Westfalen, Düsseldorf. In 2001 when property speculation around the East end of London brought an end to most of the affordable artist-run spaces, Dring moved to Amsterdam where she has made her home.

One-person exhibitions of her work have been held at the Künstlerverein Malkasten in Düsseldorf, the Ausstellungshalle zeitgenössische Künst Münster in Münster, Elizabeth Dee in New York, Q.E.D Gallery in Los Angeles, TORCH Gallery, Amsterdam, The British Council in Prague, Sies & Hoeker in Duesseldorf and rahncontemporary in Zurich. She has been included in many group shows in Europe, North America and Asia including Cheongu International Craft Biennale, Korea, *Idylle* at DA2 Domus Artium 2002 Salamanca, Spain, *Between Time and Space* at The Nunnery, London and in the touring exhibition *Landscape Confection* at the Orange County Museum of Art, organized by the Wexner Center for the Arts in Columbus, Ohio.
